HELP WANTED

Over the past few years, our Diocese has been working closely, under the guidance of our Bishop, with Ron Huntley Ministries to help set our diocese on fire with love for our Lord. Part of the process has been to help pastors look at their parishes and assess the needs and areas of growth.

One of the areas brought to my attention is the fact that every weekend we get many visitors. It would be excellent to have dedicated Cathedral parishioners assigned at every weekend Mass to greet and welcome them and offer help, giving general information about the Cathedral, Mass and confession times, how to become a parishioner, baptism etc.

Our ushers already do an excellent job in seating, handing out bulletins, greeting and taking up the collection. This new group would be focused on helping with extra assistance. Anyone interested in committing to this endeavour (it may be weekly or less depending on the number of volunteers) can contact the office in the next two weeks, leaving your name and contact information. We would begin ideally at the beginning of Lent. Training would take place in the last two weeks of February.

Another concern is **our parish school, St. Nicholas**. Unfortunately, due to difficult economic times and other circumstances, a number of children come to school hungry or with very poor nutrition. There are programs in place to help but everything is limited.

I have committed to going once a month, possibly twice, to feed the children at lunchtime. With the assistance of Dagmar, we have already made a hearty soup for the children. If you would like to be involved with this project, we could use frozen vegetables, bread or crackers. Large soup pots would be happily accepted. Anyone interested in helping with the making and serving of the soup or any other meal suggestions would be greatly appreciated. If you are able to offer any help, I thank you in advance.
