SECURITY AT THE CATHEDRAL

At the Cathedral, we have been blessed with more and more people desiring to get together and deepen their faith. Because of this, we have numerous groups using the Church proper, the parish hall and the meeting room throughout the week.

At the same time, we have an increase in people testing doors at night to see if any are open. There are numerous keys that have been given out over many years and this presents a significant security threat. To strive to keep the Cathedral secure, there will be placed at the entrance of the Church and the hall, books for signing in. Whoever is opening the Church or hall must sign in the date and time they opened and then the same for locking. Ultimately this will allow us to see who has a key and therefore who is responsible for security for each group. Secondly, we should be able to recognize anyone who has opened and know the reason for doing so. If there are names that are not recognized, then we can see if there are any unauthorized uses of the Cathedral.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping us to keep our beautiful Cathedral secure.
