SEASON OF LENT 2025

Lent begins on Wednesday, March 5th. It is a time of repentance, change of heart and prayer. The ashes that are used to mark the beginning of Lent come from the Palm branches blessed last Palm Sunday. During Lent, the liturgy prepares Catechumens to celebrate the Paschal Mystery by the various stages of Christian Initiation. It also prepares the faithful for Easter as they recall their Baptism and do penance in preparation for the greatest Feast of the year.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ashes will be blessed and distributed at Masses: 7:00 am, 12:10 pm. and 7:00 pm.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are Universal Days of Fast and Abstinence from Meat. Fasting for those 18 years to 59; abstinence from meat for those 14 years and older. Those who are excused because of ill health or other reasons are urged to practice other forms of penance and self-denial.
